

ARE YOU SHOPPING FOR A DJ??

Some questions you should ask.

1. Do they have a resume including, not only satisfied clients, but also banquet facilities, caterers, etc.?

These are the people that see hundreds of disc jockeys perform each year and will recommend only the best and most reliable companies. **Be wary if a DJ company cannot or will not provide such references!**

2. Do they have a multitude of add-on charges?

Will you be **charged extra if you request the owner of the company, a particular DJ**, or equipment (such as microphone, extra speakers, lights, disco ball, fog machine, bubble machine, etc.)? **Be wary, it could mean that even though the company owner has 20 years experience (therefore WORTH more), the DJ that they send could be on his/her first event and extra charges can quickly add up to hundreds of dollars!**

3. If they are on a “recommended vendor list”, do they pay a fee to be included, or are they listed because they are a reputable, trusted vendor?

Be aware that a few facilities and bridal stores will recommend vendors only if they pay a fee to be on their list. This could cut down on the quality and reliability of the company and only be a reflection of their willingness to pay to be “on the list”.

4. How long have they been in business and is this their full-time business or only a weekend "hobby" ?

True professional business people will have company standards, their prices will reflect that they are professionals and they will be members of some business-oriented organization of their peers, such as the American Disc Jockey Association, etc. If this is a full-time business, they will be serious about customer satisfaction and reliability by constantly seeking to improve and broaden their knowledge & skills. **Be wary if their prices are so low that it couldn't possibly be a full-time job, or if they cannot set up a meeting during the week because they can't get away from their “regular job”.** They could be sub-contracting out to other DJ's, or hiring other “hobbyists” for a low fee.
